CREDIT COUNSELING

HEALTH SERVICES

Group health and accident insurance coverage is usually terminated shortly following layoff - often in 30 days or less. You should check with your employer to see if you are eligible for COBRA. If you are eligible you can maintain insurance coverage for a period of time by paying the premium personally. Some families may also qualify to receive health insurance assistance for their children.
