

- Central Boys and Girls Club offers nearly 160 students, ages 6-18, after-school mentoring, homework assistance, tutoring, and technology assistance.

- More than 750 students depended on the Backpack Pals program for food over the weekend.

- 15,126 students applied their STEM skills in science and agriculture projects in 4-H programs.

- Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts helped 984 students learn life skills, leadership, environmental stewardship, and self-reliance.

- The Partnership for Children's focus on quality child-care, school readiness and early literacy served 6,300 children from birth through age 5.



- The American Red Cross Disaster Services helped 124 people put their lives back together again after a fire.
- 16,197 people avoided eviction or losing their electricity and water services through The Salvation Army's Financial Crisis program.
- Path of Hope's Alpha/Mangum Houses provided a safe, secure residential environment where 16 people recovering from addiction could continue their recovery process and prepare to live independently again.

•MERCE clinic provided A1C or prenatal lab screenings to 438 uninsured or underserved patients.

•In-home care from RCS enabled 112 Seniors to live independently in their own homes.

•YMCA scholarships helped 495 people work on improving their health through fitness activities and classes.
